Munster athletes were in fine form winning 38 individual Schools titles, 36 silver medals & 31 bronze & 5 sets of Relay medals (2 gold, 2 silver & 1 bronze). Among the Munster athletes who impressed on the day were Ciara Neville, Castletroy College who won double gold in the Inter Girls 100m & 200m also setting a new record in the 100m with her blistering run of 11.64 & exceeding World Youth & EYOF standards & Alice Akers, Scariff CC who threw 56.20m in the Senior Girls Hammer to win gold & set a new Irish Schools record. Later in the day she was awarded the Lar Byrne Memorial Trophy for "Athlete of the Championships". Daniel Ryan, Thurles CBS was another stand out performer jumping 7.10m in the Inter Boys Long Jump to equal Jonathon Kron's 1989 School's record & achieve the EYOF standard with him recording his second gold of the day in the Inter Boys 100mH with his run of 13.07, just off the Schools record of 12.97H held by Carlton Haddock. Ryan, a junior athlete, jumped out to a new personal best of 6.77m to win gold to add to his Junior Schools title. His older brother Daniel won silver in the same event, just 5cm behind him with his jump of 6.72m. SIAB Schools T&F International, 18th July 2015

The SIAB Schools U/17 Track & Field International took place in the Grangemouth Sports Stadium, Falkirk, Scotland on Saturday 18th July 2015 with Munster athletes taking home 5 individual medals in total (1 gold, 2 silver & 2 bronze). There was a gold medal win for **Orlaith O'Brien, Ursuline Waterford/Ferrybank A.C.** when she launched her javelin out to 46.56m in very windy conditions to secure 1st place. Our double silver medal winner was Irish Boys Captain, **Daniel Ryan, Thurles CBS/Moycarkey Coolcroo A.C.** who leaped out to 6.96m in the Long Jump & raced 13.25 over the 100mH. Bronze medals were won by **Gearoid McMahon, St. Caimin's Community School/Shannon A.C.** in the 3km Walk in a personal best time of 13.58.29 with Gearoid still being able to compete in this event next year. **James French, Bandon Grammer School/Bandon A.C.** also put in a tremendous effort in the Shot Putt launching it out to 15.01m & a new personal best to win the second bronze medal for Munster. In the Relay competitions, **Lauren Ryan, Crescent College/Dooneen A.C.** won gold with the Irish Girls 4 x 100m Relay team who managed to hold off the might of the English at the line in a time of 46.32. Both **Cathal Locke, Crescent College/Dooneen A.C.** & **Jamie Mitchell, Ard Scoil Rís/Emerald A.C.** won bronze medals with the Irish Boys 4 x 400m Relay in a time of 3.22.11.

GloHealth Irish Schools Combined Events Championships – 7th November 2015

A strong Munster Squad of 21 athletes travelled to Athlone taking home 8 National medals (3 gold, 4 silver & 1 bronze) with 10 Munster athletes (4 girls & 6 boys) also qualifying for the SIAB Schools International competition in the Emirates Arena, Glasglow on Saturday 12th December 2015. Daniel Ryan, Thurles CBS also set a new Irish Schools Record of 3,785 points in the Inter Boys competition.


4 very successful Munster competitions took place from September 2014 to May 2015. Numbers were up in all competitions with Munster athletes scoring highly in all National & International competitions.

Competition Review 2015 Gold & Silver Individual Medals for Munster Athletes



A very strong Irish team of 16 athletes travelled to the Emirates Arena, Glasgow to represent their schools & country at the SIAB Schools International Combined Events Championships on Saturday 13th December. It was an historic day for the Schools International athletes who brought home the largest medal haul ever in this event, 2 gold, 2 silver & 1 bronze in the individual competition, 1 gold & 3 silver in the team competition & a new record of 4,045 points in the Intermediate Girls set by Elizabeth Morland.

Best Individual performance from our 4 Munster athletes came from Daniel Ryan, Thurles CBS who took the gold medal in the Intermediate Boys competition a year out of his age with just 5 points to spare posting a new pb of 3645 points, an improvement of 145 points from the All Ireland Schools Championships in November. Daniel led the competition from the second event & managed to hold off the tremendous pressure from the leading English athletes setting 3 new pbs on the day in the 60mH (8.28), Shot Putt (14.12m) & 200m (23.00). His brother David continued the charge of the Irish when he finished an excellent 2nd place in the Junior Boys competition which was a very close affair with just 55 points separating the top 4 in the competition. Lying in 3rd place after 4 events, just 1 point away from the silver medal & 57 points from gold, David gave it his all in the 800m running a new pb of 2.12.67 which moved him up to 2nd, 27 points away from gold. He posted a new pb of 3234 points setting 4 new pbs on the day in the 60mH (9.01), Long Jump (6.14m), Shot Putt (12.72m) & 800m & improved his overall score by a massive 394 points from the All Ireland Schools Championships in November. Sophie Meredith, SMI Newcastle West also won a brilliant silver medal in the Junior Girls competition a year out of her age. She finished the competition on 3437 points behind Scotland's Holly McArthur & set a new pb in the 800m of 2.31.18 & was just 1cm off her pb in the High Jump at 1.62m. Vicki Cusack, Davis College, Mallow finished in 8th place overall in the Junior Girls competition having given good solid performances in all her events & posting an overall total of 3238 points. Best team performance on the day for the Irish team was the gold medal win by the Irish Junior Girls team of Sophie Meredith, Vicki Cusack, Kate O'Connor & Bronagh Walsh. This was another historic win as Ireland have never taken gold before in this competition, final score was 10062 points for Ireland & 9322 points for England. The Irish Junior Boys team of David Ryan, Aaron Sexton, David Murphy & Thomas Mullen won silver behind the English with the Irish Intermediate Boys team of Daniel Ryan, Shane Joyce, Keith Marks & Ryan Murray also winning silver behind England.



Tailteann Trophies for McMahon & Ryan





The GloHealth Tailteann Interprovincial Track & Field Championships took place on Friday 19th June in Morton Stadium, Santry. Munster athletes took home 24 medals in total (8 gold, 7 silver & 9 bronze). It was a day of mixed fortunes for our athletes but some of the highlights on the day were **Gearoid McMahon, St. Caimin's Shannon** winning the Roisin O'Callaghan Memorial Trophy for the Best Athlete in the Race Walking event in a new personal best time of 14.06.17, over 68 seconds clear of 2nd place & **David Ryan, Thurles CBS** winning the Michael Farnan Memorial Trophy for the Best Long Jump Athlete. Ryan, a junior athlete, jumped out to a new personal best of 6.77m to win gold to add to his Junior Schools title. There was a gold medal win for **Orlaith O'Brien, Ursuline Waterford/Ferrybank A.C.** when she launched her javelin out to 46.56m in very windy conditions to secure 1st place. Our double silver medal winner was Irish Boys Captain, **Daniel Ryan, Thurles CBS/Moycarkey Coolcroo A.C.** who leaped out to 6.96m in the Long Jump & raced 13.25 over the 100mH. Bronze medals were won by **Gearoid McMahon, St. Caimin's Community School/Shannon A.C.** in the 3km Walk in a personal best time of 13.58.29 with Gearoid still being able to compete in this event next year. **James French, Bandon Grammer School/Bandon A.C.** also put in a tremendous effort in the Shot Putt launching it out to 15.01m & a new personal best to win the second bronze medal for Munster.
