National Records for Munster Athletes

Munster athletes continued their winning ways on Day 3 of the GloHealth National Juvenile Track & Field Championships in Tullamore on Sunday 12th July 2015 winning 63 medals in total (24 gold, 16 silver & 23 bronze). 6 National records were also set by the athletes below:-

- Ciara Sheehy, Liscarroll A.C. threw 14.10m in the Girls U/14 Shot Putt to beat the 2014 record of 14.07m set by Aoibhinn McMahon, Blackrock A.C. Louth.
- Miriam Daly, Carrick-On-Suir A.C. ran 34.90 to better the 2009 record of 34.98 set by Ciara Giles Doran, Ferrybank A.C.
- **Joseph McEvoy, Nenagh Olympic A.C.** jumped 1.82m in the Boys U/15 High Jump to better the jump of 1.81m set by Ben O'Donovan, Abbey Striders A.C. in 2014.
- David Ryan, Moycarkey Coolcroo A.C. ran 32.16 to beat the record of 32.90 set by Colin Nolan, Enniscorthy A.C. in 2010.
- Orlaith O'Brien, Ferrybank A.C. threw 44.23m in the Girls U/17 Javelin to better the 2014 record of 42.85m set by Michaela Walsh, Swinford A.C.
- Lauren Ryan, Dooneen A.C. ran 24.73 in the Girls U/17 200m to better the 2012 record of 24.88 set by Roisin Harrison, Emerald A.C.

(31.74m) & bronze for Ricky Carroll, Fanahan McSweeney with a throw of 29.82.

6 New CBP's Set in the Field Events

Joseph McEvoy (Nenagh Olympic AC) set a new championship best performance in the high jump with his clearance of 1.82m in the U15 boy's competition. Another in record breaking form was Ciara Sheehy (Liscarroll AC) as she launched the shot put out to 14.10m in the U14 contest. Owen Russell (St Andrews AC) dominated the U19 hammer competition setting a new CBP of 65.75m.

Orlaith O'Brien (Ferrybank AC) continued to improve in the U17 javelin as she won the title and set a new CBP of 44.23m. Jordan Hoang (Tullamore Harriers AC) leaped out to 14.11m to keep the records rolling on a great day of competition in Tullamore. Liam Connaughton (Dunleer AC) was over 50m in the U16 javelin as he claimed the national title with a throw of 52.85m, another CBP.

Close Duels on the Track

Of the long hurdlers in action Ciaran Barnes (City of Lisburn AC) clocked the fastest time of the day in the 400m hurdles as he won the U18 title in a time of 55.10. Kelly-Ann Doyle (Carrick on Suir AC) won the girl's U19 title in a time of 63.32 seconds.

Carla Sweeney (WSAF) timed her sprint to perfection to win the girl's U18 1500m title in a time of 4.58.60 while Clodagh O'Reilly (Annalee Striders AC) dominated the U19 contest with a winning margin of nearly six seconds as she won the title in a time of 4.49.07. Local athlete Chinie Izuchukwu (Tullamore Harriers AC) was a popular winner of the boy's U19 title in a time of 4.23.01.

Young Niamh Foley (St Mary's – Limerick AC) was a fine winner of the U14 200m title in a time of 25.99 seconds as Conor Morey (Leevale AC) dominated the U15 boy's event to win the national title in a time of 23.87 seconds.
