2017 Review

Munster Schools Athletics Association 2017 Review

2017 has been another hugely successful year for Munster Schools Athletics with our athletes excelling on national & international teams throughout the year in a wide range of events winning a total of 15 individual international medals (2 gold, 6 silver & 7 bronze) (up 4 from last year) 5 out of 8 of the Irish Schools Cups at the Irish Life Health T&F Championships, 41 Irish Schools titles over T&F and Cross Country (37 T&F, 2 XC & 2 CE) & 44 Tailteann medals (20 gold, 12 silver & 12 bronze) up from 29 last year together with the Boys Tailteann Trophy which was last won by Munster in 1991. Munster athletes also set 11 Munster T&F records and 7 Irish Schools records over the year.

Some of the year's highlights are set out below: -

- Munster had 4 representatives (Brian Lynch & Darragh Miniter (Inter Boys), Aisling Cassidy (Inter Girls) & Orla Coffey (Junior Girls) on the Irish team for the Schools Combined Events International in Glasgow in November 2017 with our best performance coming from Brian Lynch, Colaiste of Spioraid Naoimh who placed 6th in the Intermediate Boys.
- 6 Munster athletes (Diarmuid O'Connor (Junior Boys), Tony Odubote, Shane Monagle, Joseph & Darragh Miniter (Intermediate Boys) & Vickie Cusack, (Intermediate Girls) competed on the Irish team for the Schools International in AIT International Arena in December 2016 with Tony Odubote, Rice College, Ennis winning individual silver in the Intermediate Boys competition & Diarmuid O'Connor, Colaiste Choilm, Ballincollig finishing 4th just two points outside the medals.
- Darragh McElhinney, Colaiste Phobail Bheanntrai & Aimee Hayde, St. Mary's Newport were the standout performers for Munster at the Irish Life Health Irish Schools Cross Country Championships in Mallusk, Co. Antrim on Saturday 11th March. McElhinney, ran a superb race in the Inter Boys competition winning in 20:07. Aimee Hayde, St. Mary's Newport put in a super run in the Junior Girls race to take gold and the National title winning in 10.28. There were super silver medal wins for Dylan Casey, St. Flannan's College, Ennis in the Minor Boys race & Laura Hayes, Loreto Fermoy in the Intermediate Girls competition with a brilliant bronze medal for Stephanie Cotter, Coachford College in the Senior Girls race. Podium finishes also went to Niamh Cunneen, St. Mary's Nenagh (5th Minor Girls), Dean Casey, St. Flannan's College, Ennis (4th Minor Boys), Paul Hartnett, Colaiste an Chraoibhin Fermoy (5th Junior Boys), Jake McCarthy, Pobail Scoil na Trionoide Youghal (6th Inter Boys), Avril Deegan, Presentation Thurles (4th Senior Girls), Claire Rafter, Ursuline Thurles (5th Senior Girls), Fiona Everard, MICC Dunmanway (6th Senior Girls), Charlie O'Donovan, Colaiste Chriost Ri Cork (4th Senior Boys) & Micheal Power, St. Augustine's Dungarvan (6th Senior Boys).
- 7 Munster athletes competed on the SIAB Schools Cross Country International Teams on Saturday 19th March in Scotland with individual gold for Darragh McElhinney, Colaiste Phobail Bheanntrai in the Intermediate race and silver team medals for Darragh, Christopher O'Reilly, Douglas Community School, Thomas Connelly, Christian Brothers College Cork & Jake McCarthy, Pobailscoil na Trionoide, Youghal. Aimee Hayde, St. Mary's Newport gave a great account of herself in her first international competition coming home as 1st Irish athlete in 5th place in a time of 15.39 in the Junior Girls race.

- The Irish Life Health Munster Schools Track & Field Championships took place on Saturday 20th May 2017 in Cork I.T. Among the athletes who shone on the day were our <u>8</u> record breakers Emily Wall, Colaiste Choilm Ballincollig (Minor Girls 75m Hurdles), Ciara Sheehy, St. Mary's Charleville (Junior Girl's Shot Putt), Anna Ryan, Ursuline Thurles (Junior Girls Pole Vault), Tírna Ni Chathail, Pobalscoil na Trionoide (Intermediate Girls Hammer), Tara Ramasawmy, Presentation Waterford (U/16 Girl's Mile), Patrick Ambrose, SMI Newcastle West (Minor Boys 75mH), Mark Collins, Bandon Grammer (Minor Boys Shot Putt) & Mercy Mount Hawk Tralee (Senior Girls 4x100 Meter Relay).
- At the Irish Life Health Irish Schools Track & Field Championships in Tullamore Stadium on Saturday 3rd June 2017, Munster athletes were in fine form winning 37 individual Schools titles, 40 silver medals & 33 bronze & 10 sets of Relay medals (2 gold, 4 silver & 4 bronze). Munster Schools also captured 5 out of the 8 Irish School Cups for top scoring schools in their age categories. Munster had 7 Record breaking Irish Schools performances from its athletes Sharlene Mawdsley, St. Mary's Newport (Senior Girls 400m); Ciara Neville, Castletroy College (Senior Girls 100m), Megan Lenihan, Hazelwood College (Junior Girls Discus); Anna Ryan, Ursuline Thurles (Junior Girls Pole Vault), Ciara Sheehy, St. Mary's Charleville (Junior Girls Shot Putt), Mark Collins, Bandon Grammer (Minor Boys Shot Putt) & Castletroy College (Senior Girls 4 x 100m Relay).
- The Ryan siblings representing Thurles CBS & the Ursuline Thurles made Irish Schools
 history when all five of them lined out to compete at the Irish Life Health Irish Schools Track
 & Field Championships in June 2017 taking home 8 medals & one record between them (3
 gold & 5 silver).
- At the Irish Life Health Tailteann Interprovincial Schools Championships on Saturday 24th June in Morton Stadium, Munster athletes came to the fore on both the track and in the field winning the Boys Tailteann trophy for the first time since 1991. Our girls won 20 individual medals (9 gold, 5 silver & 6 bronze) with our boys winning 24 individual medals (11 gold, 7 silver & 6 bronze) bringing Munster's medal haul to a fine figure of 44 (20 gold, 12 silver & 12 bronze). Other highlights of the day were Alannah Neff, Carrigaline CS setting a new record of 5.08.51 in the 1500m Steeplechase, Aimee Hayde, St. Mary's Newport winning the Jack Sweeney Perpetual Trophy for the Best 1500m, Ben Donovan, Midleton College winning the Harold Osborn Trophy for Best High Jumper after a jump off between Ciaran Connolly, Colaiste Chiarain, Leixlip which Ben won clearing a pb of 2.00m & Ciara Sheehy, St. Mary's Charleville who won the Fr. Lonergan Trophy for the Best Female performance of the Championships when she threw 14.75m in the Shot Putt to take gold.
- The SIAB Schools U/17 Track & Field International took place on home soil in Morton Stadium, Santry on Saturday 15th July 2017 with Munster athletes taking home 13 individual medals in total (1 gold, 5 silver & 7 bronze), almost double their medal tally from last year (7) and 6 Relay medals (1 gold & 5 bronze). There was a gold medal win for Darragh McElhinney, Colaiste Phobail Bheanntrai in the 1500m when he ran 3.59.2. David McInerney, Hamilton High School also won gold in the 100m Non-Scoring race on the day with a time of 11.37. Miriam Daly, Scoil Mhuire COS, the Irish Girls' team Captain, took home silver in the 300mH in a time of 44.62 and was also part of the Irish Girls 4 x 300m that won bronze. Silver medals were also won by Aimee Hayde, St. Mary's Newport in the 1500m (4.33.99), Megan Lenihan, Hazelwood College in the Discus (40.22m), Caitlin Kennedy, St. John the Baptist Hospital in the High Jump (1.71m) and Liam McDonagh,

Thurles CBS in the 3km Walk (14.58.07). Bronze medals went to Ailbhe Doherty, St. Flannan's College Ennis in the 300m (40.31) and 4 x 300m; Jo Keane, St. Flannan's College Ennis in the 800m (2.12.19), Ciara Kennelly, St. Brigid's Killarney in the High Jump (1.67m), Ciara Sheehy, St. Mary's Charleville in the Shot Putt (14.76m), Sophie Meredith, SMI Newcastlewest in both the Long Jump (5.85m) and the Triple Jump (11.20m) and Sean Mockler, Thurles CBS in the Discus (50.13m).

- The Munster Schools Combined Events Championships was back to its usual venue of Nenagh Indoor Stadium and took place on Wednesday 11th October. 132 athletes took part in total (36 Minor Boys, 16 Junior Boys, 18 Intermediate Boys, 9 Senior Boys, 24 Minor Girls, 17 Junior Girls, 10 Intermediate Girls & 2 Senior Girls). There were three new records on the day Vickie Cusack, Davis College set a new record in the Senior Girls competition of 2914 points to better the record of 2622 points held by Grace McKenzie, Crosshaven, Harry Nevin, Rochestown College scored 2857 points in the Minor Boys competition to beat the record of 2103 points held by Reece Ademola, Douglas CS with Eoin Kenny, DLS Waterford scoring 2579 points in the Senior Boys category to break the existing record of 2467 points held by Paul White, Nenagh CBS.
- The Irish Life Health Irish Schools Combined Events Championships took place in AIT International Arena on Saturday 28th October 2017. A squad of 24 Munster athletes travelled to the venue for the competition as contestants from the four provinces battled it out for coveted Irish Schools titles & places on the Irish Junior & Intermediate International Schools Teams. Munster athletes won 8 medals in total (2 gold, 2 silver & 4 bronze) Gold for Vickie Cusack, Davis College Mallow (Senior Girls) & Harry Nevin, Rochestown College (Minor Boys), silver medals for Ava Coyle, Kinsale Community School (Minor Girls) & Eoin Kenny, DLS Waterford (Senior Boys) & bronze for Katie Nolke, Ursuline Waterford (Minor Girls), Aisling Cassidy, Bandon Grammer (Inter Girls), Mark Carroll, Nenagh CBS (Minor Boys) & Brian Lynch, Colaiste an Spioraid Naoimh (Inter Boys).

Schools International Combined Events - 10th December 2016

Silver for Odubote



The Schools International Combined Events Championships took place for a historic first time on Irish soil in AIT International Arena on Saturday 10th December 2016. Moving from its usual venue of the Emirates Arena in Glasgow, the Irish Schools Athletics Association hosted the International in the year it celebrated its 100th year in existence. The Irish Team won two individual silver medals (Anna McCauley, Intermediate Girls & Tony Odubote Intermediate Boys) as well as two team silvers & one team bronze.



Munster had <u>6</u> representatives on the Irish team with four of them making up the entire Intermediate Boys Irish team. The star performance for Munster came from **Tony Odubote**, **Rice College Ennis** who won an individual silver medal in the Intermediate Boys competition. Tony scored a total of 3594 points (60mH 8.36, Shot Putt 10.88m, 200m 22.71, Long Jump 6.28m, 800m 2.03.94). **Shane Monagle, Ard Scoil na Mara** was next home finishing 9th overall, scoring a total of 3287 points with brothers, **Joseph & Darragh Miniter**, **Ennistymon CBS** making up the rest of the Irish team finishing in 10th & 13th places on 3223 & 3182 points. The four boys won a bronze medal in the team event with 10104.



In the Junior Boys competition, **Diarmuid O'Connor, Colaiste Choilm Ballincollig** had a great performance scoring a total of 3158 points & just missing out on a bronze medal by 2 points. He led the Irish team home to silver team medals behind England. **Vickie Cusack, Davis College Mallow** also competed well taking part in the Intermediate Girls competition to finish in 10th place overall on 3309 points winning a silver team medal with the Irish team.

The Irish Life Health Munster Schools Track & Field Championships took place on Saturday 20th May 2017 in Cork I.T. Among the athletes who shone on the day were our <u>8</u> record breakers with the oldest records to fall dating back to 1982 & 1988: -

- Patrick Ambrose, SMI Newcastle West ran 12.13 in the Minor Boys 75mH to break the record of 12.46 set by Jamie O'Brien, Mercy Mount Hawk in 2016.
- Mark Collins, Bandon Grammer threw 14.13 in the Minor Boys Shot Putt to break the record of 13.52m set by E. Carey, St. Michael's Listowel in 1982.
- **Mercy Mount Hawk Tralee** Senior Girls 4x100 Meter Relay ran 49.44 to break the record of 49.70 set by St. Mary's Nenagh in 1988.

Irish Life Health Irish Schools T&F Championships, 3rd June 2017

Sensational Day of Schools Athletics



The Irish Life Health Irish Schools Track & Field Championships took place in Tullamore Stadium on Saturday 3rd June 2017. Munster athletes were in fine form winning 37 individual Schools titles, 40 silver medals & 33 bronze & 10 sets of Relay medals (2 gold, 4 silver & 4 bronze). Munster Schools also captured 5 out of the 8 Irish School Cups for top scoring schools in their age categories. It was a double win in the Minor Girls & Junior Girls sections with Colaiste Choilm Ballincollig winning the Minor Girl's title & St. Flannan's Ennis taking the Junior Girl's title. In the Intermediate section, two Munster schools won the honours with the Girls' title taken by SMI Newcastlewest & Thurles CBS taking the Boy's title for the second year in a row and **Presentation Brothers Cork** in 2nd place. In the Senior Girls category, both Castletroy College & Mercy Mount Hawk Tralee tied for the cup. Other highlights of the day were Ciara Neville, Castletroy College running a record of 11.52 in the Senior Girls 100m and attaining a European Junior "A" standard, Sharlene Mawdsley, St. Mary's Newport running a record of 53.99 in the Senior Girls 400m to win gold & attain a European Junior "A" standard, Joseph McEvoy, St. Anne's Killaloe jumping 2m in the Inter Boys High Jump to win gold & attain an EYOF standard & Miriam Daly, Scoil Mhuire COS running 42.64 in the 300mH to run under the EYOF standard of 43.50. Sophie Meredith, SMI Newcastlewest was just 7cm off the EYOF standard jumping 5.73m for gold in the Inter Girls Long Jump & Aoibheann O'Brien, Mercy Mount Hawk just 6cm off the European Junior "B" standard in the Long Jump when she jumped 5.89m to win the Senior Girls competition. Cathal Locke, Crescent Comprehensive ran 53.79 in the Senior Boys 400mH to win gold, a time which was just outside the European "B" standard of 53.75. The Ryan siblings representing Thurles CBS & the Ursuline Thurles made Irish Schools history when all five of them lined out to compete on the day taking home 8 medals & one record between them (3

gold & 5 silver). Daniel won gold in the Senior Boys 110mH & silver in the Shot Putt, David won silver in the Inter Boys Long Jump & Relay, Jack won gold in the Inter Boys Shot Putt & silver in the Relay, Anna won gold in the Junior Girls Pole Vault setting a new Irish Schools record of 2.92m and silver in the Discus and youngest, Dillon was 4th in the Junior Boys Pole Vault & 7th in the Javelin.
