

Podium Finishes for Cotter, Hayde & Hartnett



The Celtic International Cross Country took place in conjunction with the Antrim International Cross Country in Greenmount on Saturday 6th January 2018. In the Girls U/17 race, **Aimee Hayde, Newport A.C.** was 2nd in 14.26 with **Lucy O'Keefe, Youghal A.C.** in 7th place in 15.08. Ireland were 2nd overall behind Scotland. **Laura Healy, Ennis Track A.C.** was part of the Irish Development team and she placed 21st overall in the Celtic race in 16.26. In the U/20 Women's race, **Stephanie Cotter, West Muskerry A.C.** was 3rd home in 14.39 with **Shauna Doellken, Kenmare A.C.** in 4th with 14.43. **Laura Hayes, St. Catherine's A.C.** was part of the Irish Development team and she was 9th in 15.01 with **Aisling Kelly, St. John's A.C.** in 13th with 15.28. The Irish Women's team finished in 2nd place behind Scotland. In the U/17 Men's race, **Paul Hartnett, Midleton A.C.** was part of the Irish Development team and he had an excellent race to finish 2nd overall in 19.59 with **Tommy Connolly, Leevale A.C.** finishing in 8th place in 20.12 and Ireland winning the team competition. **Mark Hanrahan, Ennis Track A.C.** was also part of the Irish Development team and he finished in 32nd place in 21.31 with the Irish Development Team 3rd overall.
