2018 Review

Munster Schools Athletics Association 2018 Review

2018 has been another hugely successful year for Munster Schools Athletics with our athletes excelling on national & international teams throughout the year in a wide range of events winning a total of <u>6</u> individual international medals (4 silver & 2 bronze) <u>3 out of 8</u> of the Irish Schools Cups at the Irish Life Health T&F Championships, <u>51</u> Irish Schools titles over T&F and Cross Country (46 T&F, 1 XC & 4 CE) & <u>36</u> Tailteann medals (13 gold, 14 silver & 9 bronze) together with the <u>Girls Tailteann</u> <u>Trophy</u>. Munster athletes also set <u>12</u> Munster T&F records and <u>1</u> Irish School records over the year.

Some of the year's highlights are set out below: -

- At the Irish Life Health Irish Schools Cross Country Championships in Waterford in March, Munster athletes competed very well with top 3 finishes by Dylan Casey, St. Flannan's College who won gold in the Junior Boys with his twin brother, Dean close behind in the silver medal position. Tommy Fennell, St. Augustine's College took silver in the Minor Boys race with silver also for Emma Landers, Pobalscoil na Trionoide in the Junior Girls race & Niamh O'Mahony, Presentation Tralee in the Inter Girls race. In the team competitions, Munster schools took home 3 gold medals with wins for St. Joseph's CBS Nenagh in the Minor Boys, St. Flannan's College, Ennis in the Junior Boys & Waterpark College in the Senior Girls. Pobailscoil na Trionoide and St. Mary's Nenagh won silver in the Minor and Junior Girls categories with bronze for Pobailscoil na Trionoide in the Junior Girls competition.
- The SIAB Schools Cross Country International was held in Wollaton Park, Nottingham on Saturday 24th March 2018. 6 Munster athletes were selected to compete for Ireland Junior Girls Emma Landers, Pobalscoil na Trionoide Youghal Shauna McCarthy, PS Inbhear Sceine Kenmare Intermediate Girls Niamh O'Mahony, Presentation Tralee Tara Ramasawmy, Presentation Waterford Junior Boys Luke Griffin, St. Flannan's College Ennis Intermediate Boys Thomas Connolly, Christian Brothers College Cork.
- The Irish Life Health Munster Schools Track & Field Championships took place on Saturday 19th May 2018 in Castleisland, Co. Kerry. Among the athletes who shone on the day were our 13 record breakers with the oldest records to fall dating back to 1997 & 2004: Sarah Butler, Laurel Hill Secondary School (Minor Girls 800m) 2. Ella Scott, Christ King Cork (Minor Girls 75mH). 3. Kotryna Pacerinskaite Pres Mitchelstown Minor Girls Shot Putt); 4. Katelyn Reid, Pobalscoil Chorca Dhuibhne (Junior Girls Javelin) 5. Aimee Hayde, St Mary's Newport (Inter Girls 800m) 6. Ciara Sheehy, St. Mary's Charleville (Inter Girls Shot Putt) 7. Ciara Kennelly, St. Brigid's Killarney (Inter Girls High Jump) 8. - The Irish Life Health Irish Schools Track & Field Championships took place in Tullamore Stadium on Saturday 2nd June 2018. Munster athletes were in fine form winning 46 individual Schools titles, 37 silver medals & 30 bronze & 7 sets of Relay medals (4 gold, 1 silver & 2 bronze). Munster Schools won three schools cups on the day with the Ursuline Waterford winning the Junior Girls Cup, St. Flannan's College Ennis taking home the Intermediate Girls Cup and Castletroy College winning the Senior Girl's Cup. Other highlights of the day were the new Junior Shot Putt record set by Callum Keating, Hazelwood College with his massive throw of 15.10m. The Minor Girls from Munster scored a clean sweep of

titles in all the individual events winning gold in the 100m (Grace Rooney, St. Mary's Midleton), the 800m (Sarah Butler, Laurel Hill), the Long Jump (Michelle Ugwah, SMGS Blarney), the 75mH (Ella Scott, Christ the King) & the Shot Putt (Kotryna Pacerinskaite, Presentation Mitchelstown). Ciara Neville, Castletroy College won treble gold in the Senior Girls 100m, 200m & 4 x 100m Relay running a World Junior "A" standard in the 100m (11.62) & 200m (23.79) & Sophie Meredith, SMI Newcastle west jumped another European U/18 standard with her winning jump of 5.93m in the Senior Girls Long Jump. Munster athletes scored a 1,2,3 in the Intermediate Boys Triple Jump with gold for Wymin Sivakumar, Colaiste an Spioraid Naoimh, silver for Michael Tony, Colaiste Ide agus Josef and bronze for Adam Turner, Colaiste Chriost Ri and in the Intermediate Girls Javelin with gold for Katelyn Reid, Pobailscoil Chorca Dhuibhe, silver for Amy Whelan, Colaiste Mhuire Buttevant & bronze for Leanne Healy, Colaiste Muire Ennis.

- The 3 Ryan siblings, Jack, Dillon & Anna representing Thurles CBS & the Ursuline Thurles made another bit of Irish Schools history when three of them won gold on the day in the Inter Boys Shot Putt, the Junior Boys Triple Jump and the Intermediate Girls Pole Vault joining the Naughton siblings from Nenagh with the most brothers & sisters who have all won Irish Schools titles. Both families have 5 siblings who have won titles, John, Mary, Brid, Patricia & Aoife Naughton and Daniel, David, Jack, Anna & Dillon Ryan and also top the Irish Schools rankings for brothers who have won Irish Schools titles with 4.
- It was a fantastic day of athletics in Morton Stadium, Santry at the Irish Life Health Tailteann Interprovincial Schools Championships on Saturday 23rd June. Munster athletes came to the fore on both the track and in the field winning the Girl's Tailteann trophy and were second in the Boys competition having won that trophy last year after an absence of 26 years. Our girls won 20 individual medals (9 gold, 6 silver & 5 bronze) with our boys winning 16 individual medals (4 gold, 8 silver & 4 bronze) bringing Munster's medal haul to a fine figure of 36 (13 gold, 14 silver & 9 bronze). To further add to our winnings the Munster Boys 4 x 100m relay team of Cillian Griffin, Mervyn Shalemba, Marc Jones, Luke O'Carroll & Wymin Sivakumar won gold with bronze for the Girls 4 x 100m team of Lucy Sleeman, Emily De Bhal, Nikolka Stevankova, Chisom Ugweru & Lynn Vermeer. In the 4 x 300m Relay, our girls' team of Ailbhe Doherty, Lauren McCourt, Ciara Kennelly, Orla Coffey & Sophie Jackman won silver with matching silver medals for our Boys 4 x 400m team of Shane Aherne, Jake Bagge, Rory Prendeville, Andrew Collins & Basit Oyebanji. Other highlights of the day were excellent performances from Ciara Sheehy, St. Mary's Charleville who won the Fr. Lonergan Trophy for the Best Female performance of the Championships when she threw 14.70m in the Shot Putt to take gold also winning gold in the Hammer with a throw of 49.83m.
- The SIAB Schools U/17 Track & Field International took place in Grangemouth Stadium, Scotland on Saturday 21st July 2018 with <u>22</u> Munster athletes taking part & bringing home 4 individual medals in total (2 silver & 2 bronze), and 3 Relay medals (3 silver). Ciara Sheehy, St. Mary's Charleville, the Irish Girls' team Captain, took home silver in the Shot Putt with a throw of 14.84m with Niamh O'Mahony, Presentation Tralee also winning silver in the 3000m in a time of 9.52.27. Niamh also won the Sean Nyhan medal for the Best Irish Performance on the day. Bronze medals were won by Megan Lenihan, Hazelwood College in the Girls Discus (38.98m) & Orla Coffey, St. Angela's Cork in the Girls Pole Vault (3.11m). Marc Jones, Colaiste Muire Cobh also won gold in the 100m Non-Scoring race on the day with a time of 11.32.

- The Munster Schools Combined Events Championships took place in Nenagh Indoor Stadium on Wednesday 3rd October 2018. <u>104</u> athletes took part in total (20 Minor Boys, 18 Junior Boys, 16 Intermediate Boys, 7 Senior Boys, 24 Minor Girls, 10 Junior Girls, 9 Intermediate Girls). There were two new records on the day:- Ava Rochford, Rice College Ennis won the Minor Girls competition with 3041 points to better the existing record of 2694 points set by Laura Frawley, St. Mary's Charleville in 2016 & Brian Lynch, Colaiste an Spioraid Naoimh scored 2985 points in the Senior Boys competition to better the record of 2579 points set by Eoin Kenny, De La Salle Waterford in 2017.
- The Irish Life Health Irish Schools Combined Events Championships took place in AIT International Arena on Saturday 13th October 2018. Munster athletes won <u>8</u> medals in total (4 gold & 4 bronze) Gold for Ava Rochford, Rice College Ennis (Minor Girls), Laura Frawley, St. Mary's Charleville (Junior Girls) Harry Nevin, Rochestown College (Junior Boys) & Brian Lynch, Colaiste an Spioraid Naoimh (Senior Boys) & bronze for Okwu Backari, Ashton College Cork (Minor Girls), Conor Callinan, Colaiste an Chroi Naofa (Minor Boys), Katie Nolke, Ursuline Waterford (Junior Girls), & Wymin Sivakumar, Colaiste an Spioraid Naoimh (Inter Boys).
- Munster had <u>6</u> representatives (up two from 2017) (Laura Frawley, St. Mary's Charleville, Katie Nolke, Ursuline Waterford, Dillon Ryan, Thurles CBS, Harry Nevin, St. Francis College, Rochestown, Wymin Sivakumar, Colaiste an Spioraid Naoimh & Diarmuid O'Connor, Colaiste Choilm Ballincollig) on the Irish team for the Schools Combined Events International in Glasgow in November 2018. Munster athletes, Laura Frawley & Harry Nevin were Ireland's only individual medal winners with both winning silver in the Junior competitions.

Online entry continued to enhance the co-ordination and running of the Munster Schools Indoor Games in Nenagh Indoor Stadium on Tuesday 6th March. Like last year, huge numbers were the order of the day. With the aim of introducing pupils to athletics for the first time, the competitions ran from Minor to Junior to Intermediate Boys & Girls competitions with an Open Boys & Girls High

Jump. Relays proved very popular on the day with 29 schools taking part in the various age groups. Forty-four Munster schools took part on the day with all counties well represented by over 900 students.

In the Minor Girls race, our top finishers were Aisling Healy, St. Flannan's College (6^{th)} and Avril Millerick, St. Mary's Midleton (10th). Tommy Fennell, St. Augustine's College won silver in the Minor Boys race with 4th place for Cian Hodgins, St. Joseph's CBS Nenagh, 6th place for Tadgh Connolly, Abbey Community College and 9th for Tom Walsh, St. Joseph's CBS Nenagh. Clare twins, Dylan and Dean Casey, St. Flannan's College scored a 1,2 in the Junior Boys race with 5th place for their team-mate, Luke Griffin which saw St. Flannan's take gold in the team event. In the Intermediate Girls race, there was silver medal for Niamh O'Mahony, Presentation Tralee with 9th place for Tara Ramasawamy, Presentation Waterford and 12th for Rachel Hosey, Castletroy College. Tommy Connolly, CBC was our best finisher in the Intermediate Boys race when he finished 7th.
